## **Guidelines for Submitting Practice Work**

- At the end of any lesson practice questions will be given. These are designed to get you
  practicing (hence the clever name) what we have just covered. The purpose of these
  questions is to make sure any problem areas are identified & to assist the transfer of
  information from short-term memory to long-term memory (where you want it to be for
  later quizzes & tests).
- You will submit your practice questions work. To achieve the most success in the course
  I recommend practice questions be completed and handed within 1 or 2 days of being
  given. I will accept them later than that but they will not be accepted after you have
  completed the unit test.
- You will assign yourself a score from 1 to 5 on each practice work as per the standards
  on the back of this page and write that number at the top of the page of work you are
  submitting along with your name, date, page and question numbers (see example
  below). You may assign yourself a .5 score if you feel your work is between two of the
  standards.
- I will look over the work and the number you have assigned to it. If your score is 2 or more higher than my score you will automatically be assigned a 1 for that practice work.
- Practice work with scores of 4 or 5 will be considered complete while practice work with scores of 1 to 3 will be considered incomplete. Any practice work not submitted will be considered NHI (not handed in).
- Practice work will be the basis on which I determine work habits. Also, potential test
  rewrites will only be granted to students with at least a G work habit (along with other
  factors)

E (excellent) - 95% to 100%

G (good) - 80% to 94%

S (satisfactory) - 65% to 79%

N (needs improvement) - 0% to 64%
